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OVERVIEW OF MAYOR NEO GEORGE MASEGELA

The municipality also continued to strengthen participatory governance through extensive public consultations on the 2026/27 Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and Budget. These engagements provided residents with an opportunity to influence municipal priorities and contribute to the future development of our communities.

In addition, indigent registration drives were conducted across various communities to ensure that qualifying households are able to

access the support and relief measures available to them, while assisting the municipality to maintain an accurate and credible indigent database.

This quarter was also marked by the sad passing of Councillor Selina Lesley, whose dedication to public service and commitment to community development will be remembered with gratitude and respect. We extend our heartfelt condolences to her family, colleagues and all those who mourn her loss.

As we commemorate Youth Month, we honour the courageous young people of 1976 whose sacrifice helped shape the democratic South Africa we enjoy today. Their legacy challenges us to continue creating opportunities that empower young people and enable them to become active participants in building a prosperous future.

As we move closer to the upcoming Local Government Elections, it is important that we remain committed to the principles of good governance, accountability and service excellence. Regardless of political affiliation, our responsibility remains to serve all residents fairly and ensure that the municipality continues to deliver on its developmental mandate.

OVERVIEW OF THE MUNICIPAL MANAGER MR MARTIN TSATSIMPE

FLOOD RELIEF REACHES AFFECTED COMMUNITIES ACROSS GA-SEGONYANA



Following the recently signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the John Taolo Gaetsewe District Municipality and the Gift of the Givers Foundation, aimed at strengthening disaster response and humanitarian support across the district, flood relief efforts have been extended to affected communities within Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality.

Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality Mayor Neo George Masegela, Speaker Keamogetse Madikiza, Chief Whip of Council Cllr Charles Phillips, and Chairperson of the Finance Standing

Committee Cllr Lesanggang Moagi, together with officials from COGHSTA, the John Taolo Gaetsewe District Municipality and the Gift of the Givers Foundation, visited flood-stricken households to hand over relief packages and humanitarian aid to affected residents.

The wards covered during the intervention included Ward 03, Ward 05, Ward 07 and Ward 12, where vulnerable households received much-needed assistance following the recent floods.



RELIEF IN SIGHT FOR NCWENG COMMUNITY AS BYPASS NEARS COMPLETION



Mayor, Neo Masegela today, 2 June 2026, visited Ncweng in Ward 7 to assess progress on the temporary bypass structure being constructed by the Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality. The Mayor was accompanied by Ward 7 Councillor Cllr. Lesley Diphatse, Roads and Storm Water Engineer Mr Morena Molwagae, and Foreman Mr Lebogang Motingwe.

The visit follows an earlier site inspection conducted on 18 May 2026 after flooding left a section of the area inaccessible to community members. The temporary bypass is now nearing completion and is expected to provide much-needed relief to community members, particularly school-going children who have been unable to safely cross the affected area since the recent floods.

The project forms part of ongoing recovery efforts following the severe flooding that affected communities across the John Taolo Gaetsewe District. Once completed, the bypass will restore safe access and improve mobility for affected community members.



COUNCIL NEWS

SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING



Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality convened a Special Council Meeting on 29 May 2026 at the Council Chambers to consider key governance and development matters, including the 2026/27 Annual Budget, the 2026/27 Integrated Development Plan (IDP), the Service Delivery and Budget Implementation Plan (SDBIP), and Upper Limits.

The meeting was chaired by Speaker Keamogetse Madikiza and attended by Mayor Neo George Masegela, Honourable Councillors, Municipal Manager Mr Martin Tsatsimpe and officials of Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality. During the meeting, Mayor Masegela tabled the

2026/27 IDP and Budget, which set out the municipality's development priorities, planned programmes and resource allocations for the new financial year. Council subsequently approved the 2026/27 IDP and Budget.

The deliberations form part of the municipality's ongoing efforts to strengthen planning, governance and service delivery for the benefit of all communities within Ga-Segonyana. The approved 2026/27 IDP and Budget documents will be made available on the municipal website for public access.





STRENGTHENING DRIVEN PLANNING THROUGH 2026/2027 DRAFT IDP & BUDGET



Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality successfully concluded its extensive 2026/2027 Draft Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and Budget consultation programme during May 2026, reinforcing its commitment to transparent governance, community participation and responsive service delivery across all wards.

Led by Mayor, Neo George Masegela together with ward councillors, municipal leadership and sector stakeholders, the consultations formed part of the municipality's public participation process in line with the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act (Act 32 of 2000). The engagements provided residents with an opportunity to directly contribute towards municipal planning, development priorities and budget allocations for the upcoming financial year.





STRENGTHENING INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION

A key feature of this year's consultation programme was the active participation of John Taolo Gaetsewe District Municipality (JTGDM) in several wards, demonstrating strengthened intergovernmental planning and coordinated development within the district.

The programme officially commenced in Ward 10 at Gamonare-Kgotla, where Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality was joined by Executive Mayor of John Taolo Gaetsewe District Municipality, Cllr Queen Mogatle-Thoane. Discussions focused on the proposed Batlharos Bridge Project, refurbishment of water infrastructure, high mast lighting initiatives and road upgrades aimed at improving service delivery across surrounding communities.

John Taolo Gaetsewe District Municipality, led by Executive Mayor Cllr Queen Mogatle-Thoane, further participated in consultations held in Ward 04 at Mapoteng Community Hall, Ward 06 at Seoding Tribal Office and Ward 08 at Garuele Tribal Office. During these engagements, the District Municipality tabled catalytic development initiatives and infrastructure interventions aimed at accelerating integrated development and improving service delivery across the district.

The District Municipality further highlighted the importance of cooperative governance, coordinated planning and funding mobilisation to support major infrastructure and development projects within local municipalities.

KEY DEVELOPMENT PRIORITIES RAISED BY COMMUNITIES

Throughout the consultation programme, residents across various wards raised service delivery concerns and highlighted priority development needs affecting their communities. Water security and infrastructure remained among the dominant issues raised during consultations. In Ward 14 at Batlharos Bombay Sports Ground, the municipality presented planned WSIG-funded water infrastructure projects targeting Wards 8, 9, 10 and 14 for the 2027/2028 financial year, with a larger intervention phase planned for 2028. Residents were encouraged to continue sharing boreholes while interventions are underway.

Infrastructure development and maintenance also featured prominently across consultations, including discussions around road upgrades, electrification projects, bridge infrastructure, sanitation improvements and the installation of high mast lights in crime hotspot areas.

In Ward 15 at Galaletsang High School Hall in Mothibistad, concerns were raised regarding aging infrastructure, financial constraints and delays in project implementation. Municipal Manager Mr Martin Tsatsimpe further addressed concerns relating to illegal land occupation and emphasised the importance of proper planning processes before settlement development can occur.

Economic development opportunities were also highlighted during the consultation process. The municipality shared progress regarding feasibility studies exploring the establishment of a smelter aimed at stimulating local economic growth and creating employment opportunities within the municipality.

Climate change and environmental challenges affecting communities also formed part of discussions, particularly following recent incidents experienced in Tsineng and Nchweng..



WARD-BASED COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENTS

Public participation sessions were successfully conducted across numerous wards including Ward 02, Ward 03, Ward 04, Ward 05, Ward 06, Ward 07, Ward 08, Ward 09, Ward 10, Ward 11, Ward 12, Ward 13, Ward 14 and Ward 15.

In Ward 02 at Bankhara Community Hall, the municipality highlighted ongoing engagements with Kudumane Mine regarding the Social and Labour Plan (SLP) programme, including the proposed rehabilitation of the closed sports ground aimed at improving community infrastructure and development opportunities.

Ward 05 consultations at Magojaneng Community Hall focused on sanitation projects, including the construction of double-lined VIP toilets, as well as proposed high mast lighting interventions.

In Ward 09 at Maruping Community Hall, residents raised concerns relating to electricity matters, the non-attendance of Eskom and issues surrounding the upcoming Local Government Elections.

Ward 07 consultations at Gamopedi-Kgotla brought together community members, traditional leadership, councillors and municipal officials to engage on development priorities and service delivery matters affecting the area.

Additional consultations held in Wards 03, 11, 12 and 13 further provided communities with opportunities to raise concerns, contribute development inputs and engage directly with municipal leadership on matters affecting their respective wards.

COMMITMENT TO RESPONSIVE GOVERNANCE

The successful completion of the 2026/2027 Draft IDP and Budget consultation programme reflects Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality's continued commitment to people-centred governance, inclusive planning and sustainable development.

Through strengthened collaboration with John Taolo Gaetsewe District Municipality, sector departments, traditional leadership and local communities, the municipality continues to advance coordinated planning and responsive service delivery aimed at improving the quality of life for all residents across Ga-Segonyana.
